Minutes of the July 20, 2021 Regular Meeting

Mayor Cecilia McCollough called the regular meeting to order at 7:00PM on Tuesday, July 20, 2021. Councilmember Davidson led the Pledge of Allegiance and Mayor McCollough gave the invocation. Roll call was taken.

Future Agenda Items

- USDA loan documents could potentially be forthcoming.
- The purchase of the SKE lot requires a Resolution to close. It will be on the August 3, 2021 Agenda.
 - The land transition at Coyote Wash Golf Course with the Links at Coyote Wash Utilities will also require a Resolution at a future council meeting.

Town Manager Report

- The DOC contract has been signed for the inmate crews. Pricing is to remain the same.
 There were numerous regulation additions due to COVID. There has not yet been a start date released.
- The installation of the insulation at the Fire Department is scheduled to begin on Tuesday, July 27.
- Coyote Wash will be utilizing Potassium Permanganate in the Front 9 irrigation system to treat the algae build-up in the system today. This will cause a "purple rain" during the initial treatment. The system will be flushed tomorrow and this will result in a dark residue as the cleared algae runs out.
- Staff has repaired the valve into the second pond on the Front 9. This will help to maintain the one foot of freeboard that is required by ADEQ.
- Staff is gearing up to begin next week on the repair/extension of the putting green west
 of the cart barn at Coyote Wash Golf Course. The plan is to remove the existing hill,
 remove 8 palm trees, repair the irrigation system, and expand the green to cover 18,000
 sq feet. This will add a much-needed practice area for the golf course. We have been
 lacking this amenity as compared to other courses in the area.
- Staff has received the quote for the new clarifier at the Water Plant. It came in at \$315,000 plus installation. This will be the first step in the needed expansion of production at the Water Plant.
 - o Staff will also be attending an ADEQ Funding Seminar to look for funding for this project.
 - The American Relief Act monies may be able to be utilized for this project.

- The Fire Department has received a request from Martinez Lake Fire Department to donate the old response truck and old fire engine. Staff is researching the details and requirements as to how to handle the process.
- National Guard 3-4 engineers originally slated to work in Wellton have been rerouted to the flooding in Flagstaff. This has delayed our plans for road repairs.
- Water Plant filter media has been scheduled for replacement. This is to help alleviate the smell in the water that we tend to get during the summer months.
- Broadband Committee have issued the Request for Proposals and the tentative date of award is September 20, 2021.
